### What type of gift can I leave in my Will for the Women's & Children's Hospital Foundation?

It is important that you choose the type of gift that is right for you and your personal circumstances.

We recommend discussing your wishes with your loved ones and seeking independent legal advice when preparing or updating your Will.



**Specific sum of money** – also known as a pecuniary bequest, this is the gift of a fixed sum of money.



**Percentage of your estate** – you can gift your entire estate or any percentage of it. Even a small portion of your estate will make a huge difference.



**Specific item** – you may gift an item such as real estate, shares, a piece of art or jewellery.



**Residual gift** – this is a simple way to leave the remainder of your estate to the WCH Foundation after all other specific gifts to loved ones have been made.



**Conditional bequest** – the WCH Foundation will only receive a gift if certain conditions have been met, such as in the unlikely event that a beneficiary doesn't survive you.



## Checklist for your solicitor

1. Discuss provisions for family members, regardless of whether they are dependent. The Women's & Children's Hospital Foundation believe that family must be considered first.
2. Ensure the correct wording is used including our full name (with the word **Foundation**) and ABN.
3. If your client wishes to direct their gift to go to a specific area of our work, please contact us to ensure their specific request can be met and to obtain our suggested wording.
4. If your client would like to honour a loved one, we encourage you to contact us to discuss opportunities for naming and recognition.

## Suggested wording for your Will

<b>1. Beneficiary</b>	"I, _____, give to the Women's & Children's Hospital Foundation Incorporated (ABN 99 682 331 968)
<b>2. Type of bequest</b>	The rest and residue of my Estate; <i>or</i> _____ per cent of my Estate; <i>or</i> _____ per cent of the residue of my Estate; <i>or</i> the sum of \$_____
<b>3. Purpose – area of greatest need</b> <i>or</i>	Free of all duties and testamentary expenses for its <u>general purposes</u> and I direct that the receipt of the Chief Executive Officer or other proper officer of that organisation shall be sufficient discharge to my executor who shall not be bound to see the application of my gift.
<b>3. Purpose – medical research</b>	Free of all duties and testamentary expenses and I express the wish (without creating any trust) that the gift be designated to <u>medical research</u> and I direct that the receipt of the Chief Executive Officer or other proper officer of that organisation shall be sufficient discharge to my executor who shall not be bound to see the application of my gift.
