Historically, this annual exhibition showcased work from individuals within the health network, however over the last two years, related to the additional pressures of the Covid-19 pandemic, we received some unexpected collaborative works from teams and units wanting to use the exhibition opportunity to create a team building activity.

For 2023 the Arts in Health team decided to curate this year's Talent Within exhibition as a team collaborative project inviting all WCHN wards, units, and departments to work to the theme 'WHO WE ARE'. Interested departments and areas were provided with a canvas to paint or draw on, make a collage or decorate it however they chose.
