As an artist captivated by the enchanting diversity of the animal kingdom, Amaya's work seeks to illuminate the beauty found within each creature. Drawing serves not only as a method of relaxation but as an outlet for her creative energy, since she learned to draw as a child.

At the age of 13, Amaya proudly shared her passion with the world through her debut book, "Amaya's Animal Alphabet," a journey through the alphabet intertwined with her artistic interpretations of beloved animals. Simultaneously, Amaya held her first solo exhibition at The Riddoch Art and Cultural Centre in Mount Gambier.

As an artist with autism, Amaya wishes to inspire others to focus on honing their potential and follow their dreams instead of dwelling on their limitations.

With a dream to reach a wider audience and touch hearts around the world, Amaya Gamage continues to create, inspire, and share the beauty of animals with a growing community of admirers. Amaya has won many art awards and was nominated for Young Achiever of the year in South Australia in 2024.


