

THE GREY AREA An exhibition by Cat Dean





The *Grey Area* is a collection of surrealist graphite works created between 2016 and 2020 by Cat Dean, inspired by her personal journey through the complexities of motherhood and self-discovery. These years were marked by the transition from the relentless demands of raising toddlers to the bittersweet milestones of sending her children off to school, a period where life felt both overwhelming and transformative.

In this season of chaos and caregiving, Cat found solace in the intricate process of creating her art. Each piece was a sanctuary—a moment of stillness where she could quiet her mind, embrace the details, and immerse herself in a meditative state of drawing.

The meticulous craftsmanship reflects not only her artistic skill but also the therapeutic nature of her practice, where time seemed to slow down, and clarity emerged. Rendered delicately with just a graphite pencil, these pieces reveal the subtle contrasts and textures of life's complexities.

The Grey Area is a poignant celebration of introspection, motherhood, and the transformative power of art as a means of self-expression and healing.

Cat Dean is a Mount Barker-based muralist, fine artist, and illustrator with a Bachelor of Media Arts (2009). Her artistic practice bridges fine art and large-scale public murals, combining intricate detail with striking realism. Known for her ability to capture nature, wildlife, and surreal themes, Cat creates custom artwork that transforms both private and public spaces. She loves working with clients and the joy that her commissioned artworks bring to all her clients.


