

STILL

An exhibition by Maria Parmenter



Artist Maria Parmenter describes this body of work 'Still' as a series of cloud and seascapes painted in oils on canvas. These works explore abstraction of these seascapes whilst kindling the notion and sensation of awe.

"I am mesmerised by the sky, the cloud formations and the movement of the sun. For me it's a constant distraction, ever changing and without rest, it captures my focus and divides my thoughts. It moves me."

"Often it is the everyday, the memory and trace of past moments that I have tried to represent in my works, on surfaces, either in works in ceramics or most recently with paint on canvas. This work whilst representational is not intended to work solely at this level. A bit like a journal, the works record a moment in the constant cycle of cloud and light, a still frame in the motion and passage of time."

Maria is a South Australian artist who draws inspiration from her environment on Kaurna land and uses colour and expression to capture moments in time. Formally trained in ceramics, she produced and exhibited primarily abstract sculptural work Maria's work has shifted to painting, where she enjoys its immediacy and the opportunity for colour translation.

Working in both oils and acrylics, Maria's work explores expression, gestural brush work and a typically warm, muted colour palette capturing the artist's experience of place and memory.

Maria's ceramic works are held in the Art Gallery of South Australia collection. Her paintings are in numerous private collections across Australia and the United Kingdom. Maria hopes to continue to pursue the gentle moments and memories, capturing them, holding their memory in the painted medium.

Maria has a background as a Physiotherapist and currently works part-time in the area of rehabilitation. When she is not supporting her clients, she is painting!
