An exhibition by Charlotte Tatton





Charlotte Tatton is an emerging artist based in Adelaide, South Australia. Charlotte completed a Bachelor of Visual Art at Adelaide Central School of Art in 2021. Since graduating, she has exhibited in a range of galleries across Adelaide, including FELTspace, Floating Goose, Gallery M, The Main Gallery, and Endspace Gallery. She has also shown work interstate at The Long Gallery in Tasmania and Backwoods Gallery in Victoria. Charlotte has continued her development through additional training, including painting courses and an intensive Drawing Marathon at the New York Studio School.

Most recently, Charlotte completed an international residency at Aviario Studio in Portugal, screen-printing workshop in the UK and is currently undertaking a Guildhouse Catapult mentorship with artist Fran O'Neill.

Charlotte Tatton's practice explores themes of domesticity, pattern, and abstraction through vibrant depictions of 20th-century interiors and objects.

She often begins with collage as a form of drawing, constructing dynamic compositions that play with spatiality and movement, which she then translates into bold, colour-driven paintings.

Working primarily with oil paint, Charlotte explores the intersection of abstraction, still life, and materiality, particularly focusing on 1960s textiles, furniture, and domestic objects. She reinterprets the still life genre by moving away from traditional representation, prioritising formal concerns of flatness, pattern, and colour.

Charlotte merges historical and contemporary visual languages by gleaning from the textures and forms of postwar domestic objects—plastics, polyester, and reflective surfaces—creating fragmented, non-linear spaces through collage and painting. This disruption of traditional compositions investigates the relationship between painted surfaces and illusionistic space, challenging points of view and distorting depth.
